A broad definition

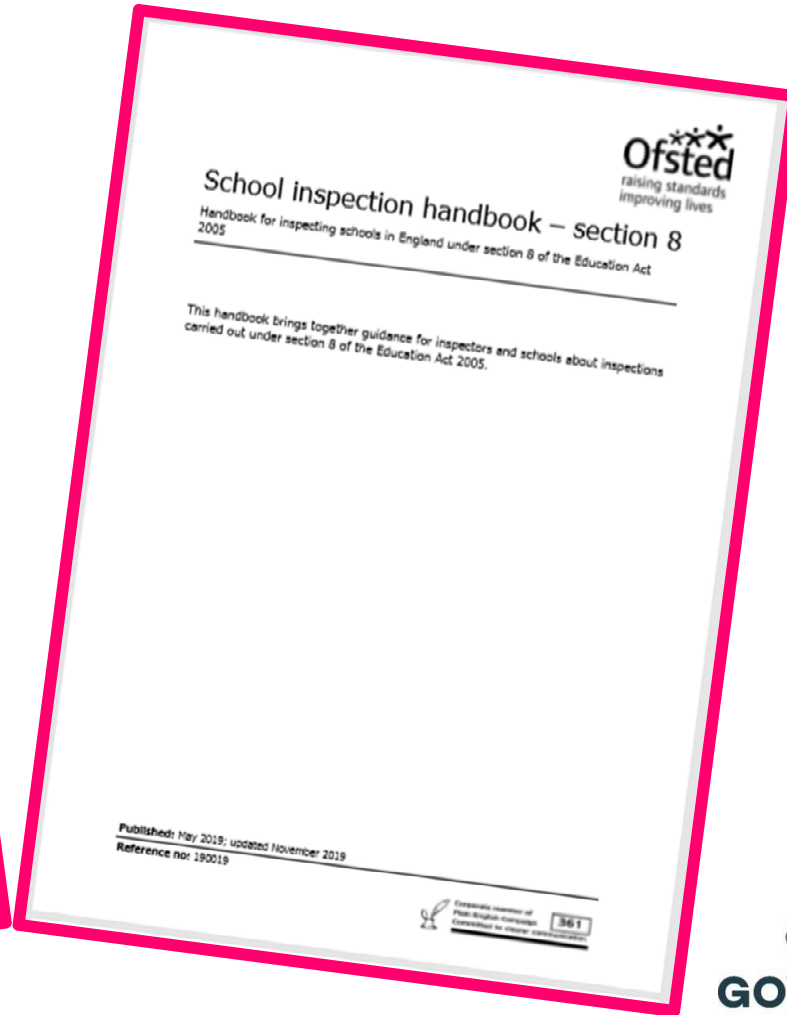
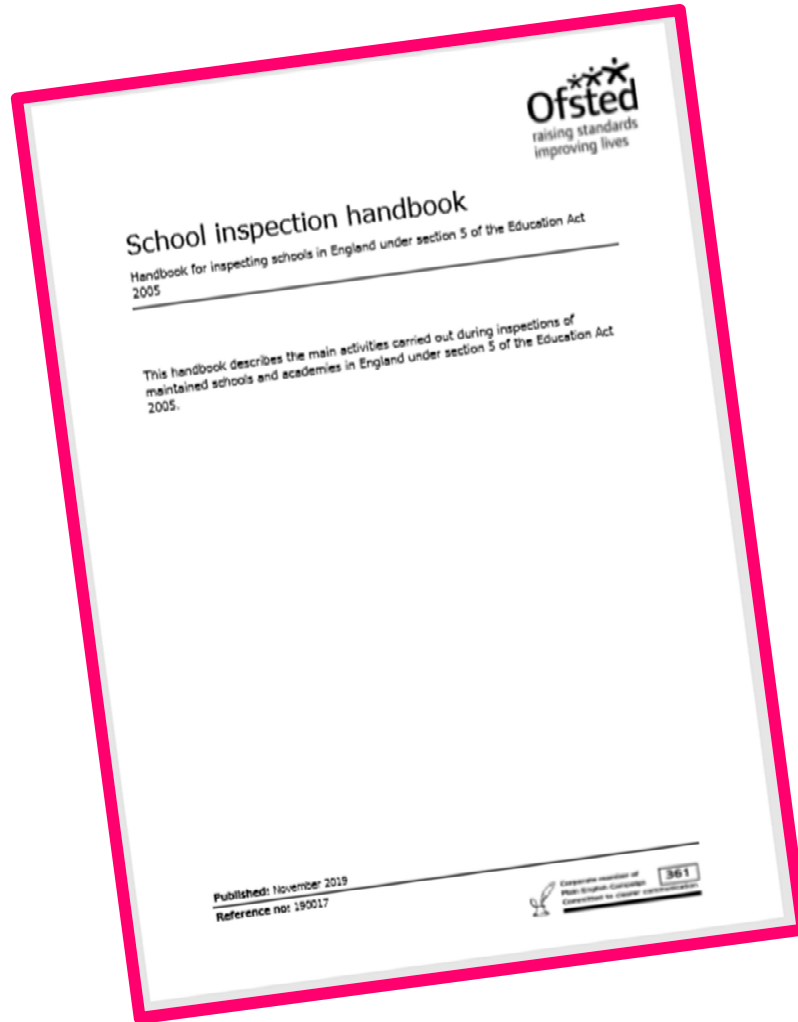
The curriculum provided by schools should extend beyond the academic, technical or vocational. Schools support pupils to develop in many diverse aspects of life. The personal development judgement evaluates the school's intent to provide for the personal development of all pupils, and the quality with which the school implements this work.

Ofsted's caveat

*It (**the judgement**) recognises that the impact of the school's provision for personal development will often not be assessable during pupils' time at school.*

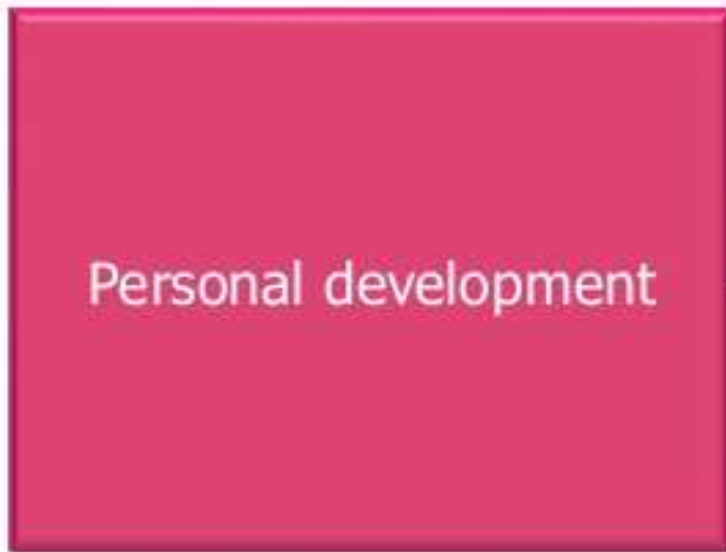

Sources of evidence:

- range, quality and take-up of extra-curricular activities
- how subjects such as citizenship, RE, PSHE, and relationship and sex education, contribute to pupils' personal development
- how well leaders promote British values
- how well leaders develop pupils' character
- the quality of pupils' debate and discussions
- pupils' understanding of the protected characteristics and how equality and diversity are promoted
